

#8 A Life of Generosity Prairie Rose EMC, April 18, 2021 Pastor Mike – Phil. 4:14-23



¹⁴ Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles. ¹⁵ Moreover, as you Philippians know, in the early days of your acquaintance with the gospel, when I set out from Macedonia, not one church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving, except you only; ¹⁶ for even when I was in Thessalonica, you sent me aid again and again when I was in need. ¹⁷ Not that I am looking for a gift, but I am looking for what may be credited to your account. ¹⁸ I have received full payment and even more; I am amply supplied, now that I have received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent.

They are a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God. ¹⁹ And my God will meet all your needs according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus.

- ²⁰ To our God and Father be glory for ever and ever. Amen.
- ²¹ Greet all the saints in Christ Jesus. The brothers who are with me send greetings. ²² All the saints send you greetings, especially those who belong to Caesar's household.
- ²³ The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen. (NIV 84)

Observations:

- 1. Their financial gift means identification with Paul. (14) "Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles"
- 2. This is a generous young church. (15&16)

 "you sent me aid again and again when I was in need."
- 3. Paul expresses his motivation in expressing his gratitude. (17) "But I seek the fruit that increases to your credit"
- 4. Generous giving is a "fragrant offering, a sacrifice acceptable and pleasing to God." (18)
- 5. "God will meet all your needs." (19)

What is "the fruit to their credit"?

- #1 If we give we will get
- #2 Approval and affirmation from God
- #3 Increased Joy
- #4 God will give them greater responsibilities
- #5 Increased reward in heaven
- #6 Enriched fellowship and intimacy
- #7 Joy that comes from knowing God is glorified

"We are channels and conduits of God's generosity, not reservoirs!"

"... the gifts you sent. They are a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God. " (18b)

Principles of faithful giving:

- #1 Faithful giving should be one of the first things we establish in our Christian walk.
 - a. How much do you want to give?
 - b. Start with 10% and see where it might lead!
- #2 Faithful giving should be focused on the spreading of the gospel.
 - a. Give to those who emphasize ministry, not money
 - b. Give where you have been or are being blessed
- #3 Faithful giving is investing in eternity. Luke 16:1-9
- #4 Faithful giving should be motivated by worship.
