Compassion Canada

COVID-19 has affected all of us, but it has been particularly devastating on those living in poverty. For those in the developing world, the economic

downfall is worse than the virus itself as measures taken to contain it have affected poor households in many ways, including job loss, higher prices, rationing of food and other basic goods, and disruptions to health care services and education. Experts predict that up to 30 years of development progress could be wiped out because of the ripple effect of COVID-19.

Because of lockdown measures and quarantines which are still ongoing in many of the 25 countries that we serve in, the nature of how we deliver our program has had to change, but the needs of the communities we work in have changed as well. Our focus is now on providing temporary short-term relief so that we can return to fully implementing our holistic child development program once the pandemic is over.

Thank you to those who are sponsoring children with Compassion, your sponsorship during this pandemic enables us to meet the urgent needs of these children and their families. The church is empowered to provide food and housing security, along with hygiene, medication and health supplies.

Compassion Canada, with its international partners and over 8000 local church partners, have together:

- Delivered more than 9.7 million food packs.
- Given over 6.6 million hygiene kits.
- Assisted more than 780,000 individuals to access medical care.
- Delivered more than 320,000 cash transfers to families in need.

We are deeply saddened that within the global Compassion family, children, family members and staff members of local church partners have passed away from COVID-19. Please pray that God would comfort these affected families and communities as they grieve.

Jan. 21 to Feb. 11 – SBC Evening Intensive: Business as Mission with Terry Kaufman 7-9:45pm

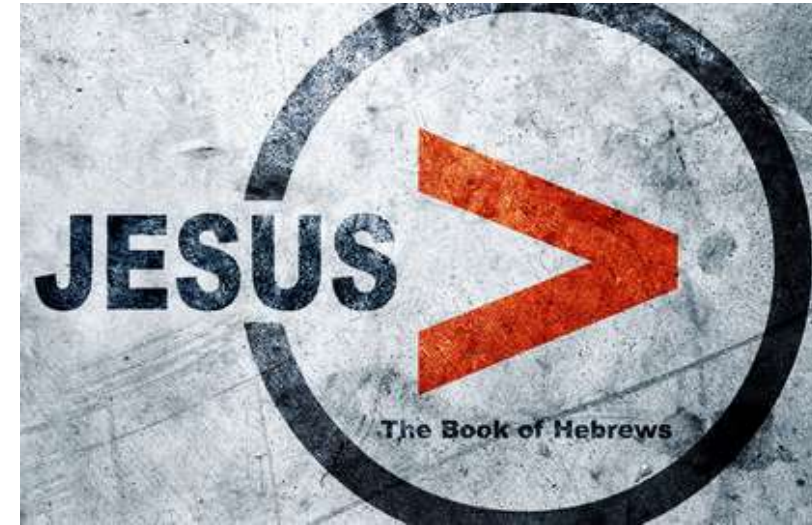
This course will introduce and explore the concept of how business and marketplace are part of God’s good plan for his people and their life of following Jesus and can serve as mission outposts. For more details and to register.
